## Market Comment:

Agent yarded 3177 head this week made up predominately small lots of old seasons last drafts. The prime lamb offering was short in supply once again with the market responding to be slightly stronger, better finished pens sold to a top of 176 for poll dorset cross lambs in the wool with the majority selling between rates of \$135 to \$165 to a low of \$110 on airfreight tryes. the small offering of stores compromised predominately of dorper lambs with the feeders competing to strengthen the market slightly with rates of \$75 to \$115 being paid for genuine store types.

The ewe mutton offering was also small in supply however took a rise accross the board to strengthen \$5 on all grades. heavy mutton sold to a top of \$166 with an autumn skin with the majority of better trade types selling at \$120 to \$145 per head. Boner types also sold well with strong local competition to sell mostly between \$90 and \$115 with poor lighter types to a low of \$65.

Merino wether lambs had stronger competition buoyed by local agents and feeders over the small offering with the majoprity selling at \$95-\$115 per head, older wethers were well supported by graziers and processors alike selling to a top of \$158 with a large draft of orange tag wethers selling to a top of \$122 to a local processor in competition with local agents.
