Market Comment:

Agents yarded 8,444 head this week with Nutrien accounting for 4,046 head of the total. The total yarding comprised of 3,536 lambs, 3,983 ewes and 77 new season sucker lambs. The quality throughout was very mixed and generally light in condition.

The few trade lambs offered lacked competition and eased back approximately \$5 per head with our top lambs making \$159.00 for a pen of 12 SAMM lambs, the majority of the trade lamb offering sold at \$130 to \$145 per head. The airfreight market eased \$5-\$8 per head with the majority selling at \$100 to \$115 per head.

Ewe mutton had limited support, with several buyers being very selective, and the market eased up to \$10 per head. The top pen of ewes made \$169 for March shorn wheatbelt merino ewes. The better heavier drafts offered sold mostly between \$145 to \$160, trades also eased slightly with the mjaority at \$95 to \$130 with the boners and lighter drafts being the most impacted easing up to \$10 per head with the majority sold at \$75 to \$95 per head

The store wether lamb market remained similar to last week however quality slipped dramatically. The majority of store wether lambs sold to graziers and agents at \$75 to \$95. Older store wethers sold to graziers at a top of \$120 with one line of heavy wethers selling to the trade mutton market at \$174.
