## **Market Comment:**

Agents yarded 8670 head this week with Nutrien accounting for 3643 head of the total. The Total yarding comprised of 1194 new season lambs, 4176 ewes and 2130 old season lambs. The lamb yarding lacked big drafts of trade types while the ewe mutton offering was of an increased quality over the last few weeks.

New season lambs took front row this week with an a solid draft of dorper lambs being the highlight at \$145 per head while the remaining drafts lacked any real heavy weights and were more competed on by the airfreight and grazier markets which kept the market fairly even on last week. Old season lambs also lacked any big trade drafts and remained the same.

On the back of an easier mutton market last week we saw an increase in local competition, especially on the several larger drafts offered. Most better ewe mutton sold at \$115 to \$130 per head with a top of \$145 to graziers. Boner and lighter trade types also strengthened slightly with bigger drafts gaining more confidence in buyers with the majority being sold at \$90 to \$110 per head

Store wether lambs and hoggets remained similar with support from local agents and graziers continuing. The majority of drafts making \$90 to \$115 with bigger framed woolly types upto \$130 per head.
