Market Comment:

Agents yarded 11,221 head this week with Nutrien accounting for 4034 head of the total. Mutton dominated the numbers yet again continuing the trend (4667 Head). New season lambs continue to lack quality and numbers (485 Head). The balance of the yarding was made up of store to forward store wether hoggets and surplus Rams.

Our small trade offering on lambs make for a very hard quote, our first offering of lambs were a standout in our yarding being sold at \$135 for 21 new season Suffolk cross lambs. The general market feel is no change for trade types on the previous weeks while store crossbred lambs eased slightly with the majority selling at \$80 to \$110.

The Ewe mutton had some good offerings of larger drafts, Nutriens top offering selling at \$151 for 83 Merino Ewes while the majority sold at \$130 to \$145 per head with the trade types selling at rates of \$120 to \$130 per head to be very similar to last weeks sale. Lighter and boner mutton eased back up to \$5 per head after last weeks rise to be sold at rates of \$90 to \$115 and down to a low of \$70.

Store merino wethers eased up to \$8 per head with a lack of competition from the previous sales. Most sold at rates of \$85 to \$110 per head. Merino Ewe hoggets eased slightly after last week strong offering and support, agents once again competed and bought the majority at rates of \$110 to \$140 per head while small and lighter types sold to a low of \$60 per head
