Market Comment:

Agents yarded 9910 head this week with Nutrien accounting for 4595 head of the offering. Mutton continues to make up the large majority of the offering (2729 head). New season lambs numbers improved slightly however quality was still lacking (848 Head).

Our small offering of lambs lacked any top quality drafts with the top pen being sold at \$150 for 23 crossbred sucker lambs while the majority of trade types remained similar at rates of \$135 to \$145 per head. Airfreight and lighter trade types also remained similar selling at rates of \$120 to \$130 per head with the store grades selling at mostly \$85 to \$125 per head competed on by agents and feeders.

The ewe mutton had some good offerings of larger drafts again. Nutriens top offering sold at \$160 for ewes sold on behalf of Murdoch University, with the majority of the heavy offering selling at \$130 to \$145 per head with the trade drafts selling at rates of \$120 to \$130 per head to be slightly easier on last week. Lighter and boner mutton came back \$2/3 per head with a slight ease in competition from buyers with the majority selling at \$85 to \$105.

Store merinos remained similar with limited numbers to compete on. Most sold at rates of \$85 to \$110 per head. Merino ewe hoggets remained similar while also being limited in supply, selling at rates of \$100 to \$130 per head while small and lighter types sold to a low of \$50 per head.
