Market Comment:

Agents yarded 7409 head this week with Nutrien accounting for 3691 head of the offering. Mutton continues to make up the large majority of the offering with 3682 head. New season lamb numbers increased slightly with quality also increasing up to 1387 head.

Our trade lamb offering improved significantly this week with the market moving slightly stronger. Our top pen sold at \$157 for 14 crossbred sucker lambs on behalf of BA Ball, while the majority of trade types sold at rates of \$135 to \$145 per head. Airfreight and lighter trade types also strengthened slightly selling at rates of \$120 to \$135 per head with the store grades selling at mostly \$85 to \$115 per head, competition from agents and feeders keeping the market similar.

The ewe mutton had some good quality trade types in smaller drafts. Nutrien's top offering sold at \$169 for a draft of 167 merino ewes sold on behalf of D & K Dunne, with the limited numbers of remaining heavy mutton selling at \$150 to \$165 per head with the trade drafts selling at stronger rates of \$120 to \$150 per head. Lighter trade and boner mutton also strenghtened with the majority sold at rates of \$85 to \$115 per head.

Store merinos remained similar with limited numbers to compete on. Most sold at rates of \$80 to \$115 per head with good trade types up to \$130. Merino ewe hoggets remained similar while also being limited in supply selling at rates of \$100 to \$130 per head while small and lighter types sold to a low of \$50 per head.
