Market Comment:

Agents Yarded 7046 head this week compromising of 2014 ewe mutton and 4043 lambs, of which lacked quality seen in the last few sales. Evenso the majority of the market strengthened or firmed to finish at better rates than last weeks offering.

The few trade lambs offered enjoyed strong support from local processors with Nutriens top pen of lambs selling at \$189.00 on behalf of Wood Valley, while the majority of the better trade lambs sold at rates of \$140 to \$165 per head finishing approxiamtely \$5 dearer than last week. The airfreight & shipping types were highly sought after with the return of a major feeder to the market place pushed along by processors and other local feeders with the majority selling at rates of \$120 to \$140 finishing to be \$10 to \$15 stronger on last weeks easier market. The genuine store types also took a slight rise selling predominately at rates of \$75 to \$120 per head to a low of \$40.

Ewe Mutton offered in larger drafts once again attracted a premium over smaller drafts in a very strong market. heavy trade ewes were competed on by several processors topping out at \$179.00 for a pen of Merino Ewes on behalf of BR Franklin & \$ McCombie, The majority of heavy ewes sold at rates of \$146 to \$165 per head finishing upto \$5 stronger on last week while the trade grades also saw a slight increase in competition selling at \$130 to \$145 per head, boners remained very similar to last week selling predomintely at \$90 to \$120 per head with light types top a low of \$40.

There were few merino wether lambs offered this week with what was offered remaining similar in the trade grades selling rates of \$125 to \$150 per head while the store grades followed suite with their crossbred counterparts strenghtening slightl selling mostly between \$90 to \$120 per head finishing stronger approximately \$5 per head.
