Market Comment:

A very large yarding this week in Muchea on the back of sheep from cyclone affected areas having to be offloaded unfortunately, a significant amount of infrastructure has been damaged meaning large drafts have been mustered and sent down with more expected next week, in total agents yarded 21,685 head with Nutrien agents offering 11,038 of the total. The majority of the yarding was made up of lambs with 13,319 head yarded and 5,517 ewe mutton offered.

There were some large drafts of good trade lambs offered with the sale highlight being a pen of 30 crossbred lambs offered on behalf of VP Sheep Husbandry of Piawaning making \$215 per head with the remaining heavy weights selling slightly stronger on last week at \$185 to \$210 per head.

Lambs in the trade weight category remain similar selling at rates of \$155 to \$175 to remain firm while the airfreight/feeder types strengthened selling at rates of \$125 to \$145 per head with genuine stores enjoying increased competition strengthening to sell at rates of \$65 to \$125 competed on by agents and graziers.

There were some good large drafts of Ewe Mutton offered in the outside pens. The Heavy ewe mutton sold at rates of \$160 to \$210 per head slightly stronger than last week while Genuine trades remain similar to last week selling at \$135 to \$155 per head with the few boners offered making \$85 to \$105 per head to also remain unchanged.

Nutrien's top pen of ewe mutton were 17 Wiltipoll ewes sold on behalf of CS Peek of Daadenning Creek for \$200 per head.

The wether lambs market even with large drafts offered remains strong with most top draft selling to processors at rates of \$155 to \$175 per head with the airfreight / feeder types selling slightly dearer to feeders and agents at rates of \$125 to \$135 while stores also strengthened on the back of agent support to sell at rates of \$65 to \$125 per head.
