Market Comment:

A smaller yarding this week with agents yarding a total of 11465 head. The yarding was made up of 5155 Lambs and 5721 ewe mutton with quality throughout, and lacking numbers of finished types.

There were only a few well finished lambs offered, with the majority of lambs yarded in store condition. Our top price lambs were a pen of 30 suffolk cross lambs that sold for \$205 per head on behalf of CG Boyle. The remaining heavy weights sold very similar at \$185 to \$200 per head.

Lambs in the trade weight category remained at rates of \$165 to \$180 while the light weights sold very similar to last week with the majority selling at \$140 to \$165 per head. The Airfreight / Feeder types eased selling at rates of \$115 to \$135 with genuine stores also easier selling at \$50 to \$110.

There were very few big drafts of ewe mutton offered, heavy ewe mutton sold at rates of \$160 to \$210 per head to be similar, Genuine trade types eased selling at \$130 to \$155 per head while light trade and boners selling at rates of \$65 to \$125 per head.

There were very few good quality store wethers available, competition came from Agents and graziers with the majority selling easier on last week. Heavy types sold at rates of \$130 to \$155 per head, and airfreight types sold at \$110 to \$125.
