Market Comment:

The muchea offering this week was a total of 7322 head with Nutrien accounting for 3090 head of the total. The yarding was comprised of 4091 Lambs and 1177 ewe mutton

The few heavy weight lambs sold at rates of \$190 to \$210 per head, to remain strong, Lambs in the trade weight category sold similarly at rates of \$165 to \$180 with the light trade strengthening slightly with the processors pushing rates to \$155 to \$172 per head. The Airfreight / Feeder types remain buoyant selling rates of \$130 to \$155 with genuine stores firm at \$70 to \$125 per head.

There were very few ewe mutton offered this week with the handful of heavy ewe mutton selling at similar rates of \$170 to \$200 per head, Genuine trade types sold at rates of \$140 to \$165 per head while light trade and boners sold rates of \$65 to \$130 per head.

There were very few good quality store wethers available, competition came from Agents buying on behalf of graziers with Better store types selling slightly dearer at \$130 to \$145 per head, lighter second drafts also remain firm at \$100 to \$130 per head.
