Market Comment:

Muchea agents yarded only 3,157 head this week making it very hard to give an accurate quote on market movements. Nutrien accounted for 1013 head. There were 2304 lambs available within the offering of which the majority were store to forward store wether lambs and 222 ewe mutton making up the balance.

There were only several pens of quality Trade Lambs available which sold at rates of \$140 to \$170 per head to a top of \$197, light trade lambs sold at rates of \$130 to \$140 to sell very similar again with feeder and store lambs following suite selling predominately at rates of \$60 to \$110 per head.

There were very few ewe mutton available and no heavy mutton yarded. The genuine trades sold at rates of \$100 to \$130 per head, Boner mutton sold at rates of \$75 to \$110 with very light boners to a low of \$31 per head.
