### Market Comment:

Agents yarded 9,126 sheep after the Easter break at Muchea Tuesday 9th April with Nutrien yarding 3,023. Lambs made up 46% of the yarding and were mostly store to light trade types which remained firm. Better trade weights sold from \$5 - \$10. Better, although heavy weights remained equal. Ewe mutton held firm although light weight and conditioned sheep received limited competition. Quality hoggets continue to be strong again. The lesser quality had limited interest. Rams sold from \$10 - \$30. Please talk to your agent prior to consigning your sheep. Next sale on Tuesday the 16th, Nutrien are first sale.
