

Muchea Sheep Report 11/02/2025

Yarding 18172 / sheep 10824 / lambs 7348

Numbers lifted to over 18,000 sheep and lambs this week nearly 3,500 more than the last sale. The buying field was crowded and actively bidding however values did ease with the higher volume over most categories. Heavier lambs were back \$25/30 and mutton across the board were softer by \$10/15/head.

Store lambs eased \$6/8 selling from \$20 to \$96 and light lambs also back \$8/10 making \$60 to \$119/head. Trade and heavy lambs eased \$25/30 with trade lambs selling from \$80 to \$135 and heavy lambs \$120 to \$170/head.

Light Merino wether hoggets ranged from \$36 to \$50 and with more weight from \$60 to \$95/head. Store Merino ewe hoggets sold from \$10 to \$60 and heavier ewe hoggets returned \$65 to \$112 /head. heavy Crossbred hoggets made \$52 to \$115 and younger rams sold to a top of \$112/head.

Mutton sold to cheaper trends with light plain ewes selling from \$2 to \$30 and heavier framed boning grades, \$20 to \$55/head. Medium ewes sold from \$50 to \$80 and heavy ewes sold to a top of \$105/head. Heavy wethers made \$50 to \$90 while mature rams ranged from \$2 to \$82/head.
