



Muchea Sheep Report 02/06/2026

Yarding 5,116/ sheep 1,874 / lambs 3,242

Numbers declined substantially this week mostly due to widespread severe weather and the long weekend also a factor. A handful of new season lambs have started to appear while heavy lamb supply was back in volume. With feedlot and processing operators displaying less competition resulted in a generally softer market with the exception of heavy mutton. Store lambs were back \$10/15 while heavier lambs eased \$5/10 and heavy mutton gained \$10/12/head.

Store lambs started from \$45 up to \$206 while light lambs made \$156 to \$230/head. Trade weights returned \$196 to \$245 while heavy lambs sold from \$229 to \$280 and cwt's over 26kg sold from \$280 to \$332/head.

Merino wether hoggets sold from \$120 to \$232 while Merino ewe hoggets were making \$130 to \$210/head. Crossbred hoggets ranged from \$130 to \$255 and younger rams sold to a top of \$270/head.

Boning ewes were making \$70 to \$180 while medium weights returned \$168 to \$230 and heavy ewes sold to a top of \$270/head. Heavy wethers ranged from \$226 to \$280 while mature rams sold from \$90 to \$150/head.
