

Muchea Sheep Report 10/06/2025

Yarding 12,375/ sheep 4501 / lambs 7874

This week saw both lamb supply and quality improve as well as an increase in sheep numbers. Good runs of heavy lambs were yarded across all Agents and store lambs generally were in better condition. This however didn't help pricing with heavy lambs easing up to \$15 and trade lambs by \$10/12 while lighter lambs held ground on value. With a full buying field heavy mutton recorded gains as did heavy wethers.

Store lambs sold from \$50 to \$123 while light lambs were selling from \$110 to \$151/head. Trade lambs eased \$10/12 to return \$130 to \$163 while heavy lambs were back \$12/15 selling from \$150 to \$225/head.

Store Merino wether hoggets were making \$50 to \$110 and with more weight and wool sold to a top of \$179/head. Merino ewe hoggets returned \$89 to \$170 while Crossbred hoggets with weight ranged from \$110 to \$200 and younger rams sold to a top \$182/head.

Boning mutton were firm making \$68 to \$132 while medium ewes returned \$100 to \$170 and heavy ewes sold up to \$190 with a fleece gaining \$8/10/head. Heavy wethers made \$129 to \$200 lifting \$10 while mature rams returned \$55 to \$120/head.
