

Muchea Sheep Report 17/06/2025

Yarding 10,982/ sheep 4093 / lambs 6889

Numbers dropped marginally from last week with around the same proportion of lamb and sheep supply. Good runs of trade and heavy lambs were presented as well as high volumes of store lambs, particularly Merino lambs. The regular buying group were all in attendance as well as a return of a major feedlot buyer and a several eastern states buyers added competition across most categories lifting the market as a whole \$15/25/head.

Store lambs gained \$20/25 ranging from \$60 up to \$156 for better types while light lambs lifted \$15/17 selling from \$130 to \$169/head. Trade and heavy lambs recorded gains of \$10/15 with trade lambs making \$148 to \$187 and heavy lambs from \$170 to \$235/head.

The heaviest Merino wether hoggets were making \$139 to \$190 with a skin while Prime Merino ewe hoggets returned \$149 to \$189/head. Heavy Crossbred hoggets ranged from \$160 to \$222 and younger rams sold to a top \$185/head.

Mutton recorded gains of \$20/30 with boning grades making \$98 to \$153, medium ewes returned \$142 to \$201 and heavy ewes sold from \$218 to \$239 with a skin. Heavy wethers made \$155 to \$243 while mature rams sold well ranging from \$70 to \$158/head.
