

Muchea Cattle Report 23/06/2025

529 liveweight and 1 veal / total 530

Supply was conservative today with just over 500 head. It was a mixed sale with some very well-presented trade steers and heifers in the yarding along with good runs of yearlings and weaners, A large proportion of the cow run were predominantly in store condition against the occasional pen of heavy cows while bulls were very limited in quantity. Most regular buyers were present along with several seasonal restockers chasing the lighter framed calves. Steers were firm to slightly softer and heifers eased 15/25c while Cows lost the 30c gains recorded last to peak at 258c/kg.

Store weaner steers were selling from 220c to 332c and with more potential realized 382c/kg. Store weaner heifers returned 160c to 242c and with more weight topped at 338c/kg. Yearling steers ranged from 290c to 358c while plain yearling heifers made 150c to 220c and with more fat cover sold to a top of 310c/kg. Pastoral steer calves sold from 166c to 280c depending on frame and condition while pastoral heifers lacking potential started from 88c to 180c and when showing condition returned 200c to 270c/kg.

Grown steers made 250c to 340c while grown heifers returned 250c to 300c/kg. Plain light framed pastoral cows sold from 10c to 120c while bigger framed store cows made 130c to 210c and fat cows returned 220c to 258c/kg.

Bulls returning to the paddock sold from 120c to 180c while shipping bulls made 170c to 250c and slaughter bulls returned 192c to 250c/kg.
