



Muchea Cattle Report 06/07/2026

990 liveweight and 0 veal / total 990

Numbers were down for a total yarding of 990 head. Prices eased with lesser quality offered and reduced buyers present. The best Angus weaner steer calves sold to 596c while the heifers sold to 462c/kg. Heavy cows gained selling to 388c while the heavy bulls sold to 348c/kg. Pastoral cattle were in good numbers with quality back on last weeks sale.

Local weaner steers sold from 470c to 596c while weaner heifers made 342c to 462c/kg. Local yearling steers returned 370c to 552c while yearling heifers were selling from 362c to 480c/kg. Pastoral steer calves sold for 456c and yearlings from 340c to 460c while pastoral heifer calves made from 270c to 404c and yearling heifers from 368c to 430c/kg.

Grown steers weighing over 600kg sold from 382c to 468c while lighter weights returned 326c to 480c/kg. Grown heifers weighing under 540kg sold from 332c to 450c and heavier weights made 408c to 452c/kg. Store cows made 158c to 290c, medium weights sold from 320c to 350c heavy weight cows were up selling to a top of 388c/kg.

Restockers and exporters paid 274c to 448c for light weight bulls while heavy bulls returned 300c to 348c/kg.
