

## Muchea Cattle Report 07/07/2025

*594 liveweight and 27 veal / total 621*

Numbers continue to remain conservative with just a slight rise from last week's total. Quality was prevalent with Well-bred local cattle representing around half of the sale and pastoral supplies were mostly showing good condition. The buyer gallery was missing one or two regulars, and some were inactive but generally the market held up well.

Weaner steers were selling from 342c to 395c with a quality driven gain of 40/50c over the last few sales. Plain weaner heifers were making 162c to 252c and better framed bodies lifted 40/50c with quality again the main driver selling from 268c up to a top of 352c/kg. Yearling steers presenting good breeding and fat cover gained 20c selling from 336c to 382c while store yearling heifers sold from 180c to 260c and better heifers from 282c to a top of 358c/kg.

Light framed pastoral steer calves were making 180c to 220c and with more weight and frame from 168c to 280c/kg. young small framed pastoral heifers were penned in bigger lines ranging from 100c to 200c while bigger framed heifers sold from 80c up to a top of 232c depending on condition.
