

Muchea Cattle Report 14/07/2025

436 liveweight and 18 veal / total 454

Although supplies were very low this week there were lines of very well-bred and well-presented grain assisted Limousin and Charolais steers and heifers as well as good lines of Angus and Murray grey calves making up half of the sale and around the same volume of Pastoral cattle of all sexes and ages. The buying field saw most regulars present, as well as an added Agent buyer from the south and a return of a feedlot buyer all adding healthy competition lifting values on grown steers and heifers as well as cows while younger calves couldn't quite hold ground on Last week's gains.

Vealer steers eased 10c selling from 330c to 380c and vealer heifers down 20c to return 220c to 310c/kg. Yearlings were also down 10c with steers, all over 330kgs selling from 314c to 354c while yearling heifers weighing under 330kg ranged from 252c to 280c and weighing over 330kg sold from 270c to 338c/kg. Pastoral vealer steers ranged from 200c to 304c and yearling steers from 162c to 293c/kg. Pastoral vealer heifers started from 128c and with more cover and frame up to 219c while pastoral yearling heifers ranged from 140c to 260c/kg.

Grown cattle lifted 10/15c with steers selling from 242c to 318c while grown heifers made 278c to 320c/kg. All grades of cows gained 20/25c with light weights selling from 158c to 222c, medium cows from 200c to 268c and heavy cows from 218c to 286c/kg.

Bulls returning to the paddock sold from 140c to 212c while shipping bulls ranged from 140c to 250c/kg. Local heavy bulls returned 228c to 250c while heavy pastoral bulls returned 200c to 232c/kg.
