

Muchea Sheep Report 22/07/2025

Yarding 15,658/ sheep 6,309 / lambs 9,349

Numbers were up by 2500 head from the last sale with increased supplies across all categories. There were good runs of trade and heavy lambs along with quality lines of heavy mutton and large drafts of fat tail sheep and lambs. Although one pen of very tidy lambs realized \$301 the lamb market overall eased \$10/12 and was erratic in places while the Mutton Market generally held ground on values.

Store lambs were a little softer selling from \$37 up to \$167 while light lambs were back \$15/20 selling from \$143 to \$194/head. Trade lambs eased \$10/12 and returned \$170 to \$224 while heavy lambs realized \$301/head.

Store Merino wether hoggets were making \$74 to \$147 and with more weight up to \$220 while Prime Merino ewe hoggets returned \$156 to \$224/head. heavy Crossbred hoggets ranged from \$140 to \$250 and younger rams sold to a top \$238/head.

Very light and plain ewes sold from \$30 to \$70 while boning mutton eased \$6/8 selling from \$70 to \$160/head. Medium weight returned \$130 to \$220 and heavy ewes sold up to \$240 to remain equal. Heavy wethers made \$141 to \$235 while mature rams returned \$50 to \$148/head
