

Muchea Cattle Report 25/08/2025

790 liveweight and 59 veal / total 849

Numbers dropped this week partly due to rains across the state. The sale consisted of a run of well-breed trade weight steers and heifers along with large lines of local and pastoral cows ranging from finished to plain condition. The remainder of the sale was mostly pastoral steers and heifers in various weights and ages.

Local weaner steers were selling from 360c to 404c while local weaner heifers were making 200c to 344c/kg. Local yearling steers under 330kg sold from 340c to 400c and heavier weights from 360c to 412c/kg. Yearling heifers under 330kg were selling from 208c to 308c and with more weight and frame from 330c to 344c/kg. Pastoral steers calves ranged from 236c to 326c while weaner pastoral heifers sold from 170c to 250c and pastoral yearling heifers returned 146c to 308c depending on condition.

Local grown steers ranged from 240c to 384c while pastoral grown steers sold from 280c to 352c and grown heifers returned 220c to 358c/kg.

Light framed plain condition pastoral cows gained little interest selling from 50c to 140c while bigger framed store cows made from 150c to 250c/kg. Heavier cows gained 10/15c with medium weight cows selling for 248c to 330c and heavy cows sold to a top of 364c/kg.

Plain bulls back to paddocks sold from 150c to 250c while bulls suited for shipping were making 200c to 280c/kg. Local heavy bulls ranged from 260c to 320c and heavy Pastoral bulls from 250c to 300c/kg.
