

Muchea Cattle Report 08/09/2025

1350 liveweight and 31 veal / total 1381

Supplies jumped this week at Muchea to 1381. The sale consisted mostly of Local and pastoral lines of store and feeder calves drafted in large lines filling sale pens. There were quite a few new faces amongst the regular crew of buyers looking at purchasing calves for restocking, backgrounding and feedlotting. Young steers recorded gains as did the cow market.

Local weaner steers lifted 50c selling from 350c to 478c while weaner heifers eased 10c making 228c to 388c/kg. Local yearling steers remained equal with steers under 330kg selling from 358c to 446c and heavier weights from 320c to 452c/kg. Yearling heifers under 330kg sold from 220c to 402c and with more weight and frame returned 340c to 396c easing 10c. Lighter framed pastoral steer calves sold from 240c to 354c and heavier bodies from 250c to 362c/kg, remaining equal. younger pastoral heifers were also firm on last week ranging from 156c to 256c for bigger framed heifers sold to a top of 342c/kg.

Grown steers were up slightly making 280c to 393c while grown heifers returned 238c to 390c/kg.

Store cows ranged from 120c to 276c while medium cows returned 242c to 338c and heavy cows sold to a top of 368c/kg, gaining 8c/10c/kg.

Plain bulls back to paddocks sold from 150c to 340c depending on quality while bulls suited for shipping made 210c to 296c/kg. Local heavy bulls lifted 10c ranging from 313c to 344c while pastoral heavy bulls were making 240c to 330c/kg.
