

Muchea Cattle Report 15/09/2025

1166 liveweight and 41 veal / total 1201

It was a similar sale volume wise this week at Muchea however steer and bull numbers fell away while cow supplies increased significantly. There were runs of local trade steers and heifers showing heavy weight and finish selling at premium values as well as good supplies of cows. On the pastoral side again drafts of large lines of cows and heifers were on offer bringing top dollar from processors and feedlots lifting the cow market 5/10c/kg. The remainder of the sale was made up of lines of local feeder type weaners and yearlings and tail end pastoral calves.

Local weaner steers were selling from 250c to 448c for better finished bodies while weaner heifers gained 15/20c making 208c to 404c/kg. Local yearling steers under 330kg sold from 304c to 390c and heavier weights from 350c to 466c/kg. Yearling heifers under 330kg were selling from 220c to 358c and with more weight and frame sold up to 402c/kg. Pastoral steers gained 30/40c with young light steer calves starting from 198c up to 350c and bigger framed store steers sold to a top of 418c/kg. Light framed pastoral heifers ranged from 150c up to 304c and bigger framed heifers sold to a top of 356c lifting 10c/kg.

Pastoral grown steers sold from 298c to 380c while local grown steers made 374c to 408c and grown heifers collectively returned 282c to 402c/kg.

Bigger framed store cows were selling from 246c to 282c while medium weight cows returned 282c to 338c and heavy cows sold to a top of 360c/kg.

Shipping bulls sold from 240c to 334c while local heavy bulls made 288c to 344c and pastoral heavy bulls returned 220c to 350c/kg.
