

Muchea Sheep Report 30/09/2025

Yarding 10,466/ sheep 5,786 / lambs 4,680

The sale total was consistent with the previous 2 weeks although there were fewer lambs and more ewes yarded. New season lambs were generally lighter today with most in the feeder weights. Most grades of new season lambs were up \$10-12 while several pens of extra heavy old season lambs sold over \$300. The Mutton market also recorded gains of \$4-5/head.

New season store lambs gained today ranging from \$100 to \$185 while airfreight weights sold from \$170 to \$220/head. Trade weight lambs were selling from \$200 to \$257 and heavy lambs returned \$240 to \$291/head.

Old season store lambs started from \$120 up to \$166 for bigger frames while light lambs were selling from \$154 to \$184/head. Trade lambs returned \$190 to \$260 while heavy lambs sold to a top of \$320 and a pen of heavy Merino ram lambs topped the market at \$335/head.

Merino wether hoggets sold from \$164 to \$202 while Merino ewe hoggets were making \$171 to \$240/head. Crossbred hoggets ranged from \$140 to \$250 and younger rams sold to a top of \$200/head.

Boner mutton were making \$98 to \$172 while medium ewes returned \$150 to \$220 and heavy ewes topped at \$240/head. Heavy wethers sold up to \$240 while mature rams sold from \$100 to \$170/head.
