

Muchea Cattle Report 06/10/2025

1956 liveweight and 27 veal / total 1983

With a large influx of young bulls and the remaining categories in similar supply to last week, numbers lifted to almost 2000 head. The sale consisted of some finished trade weights and fat cows against a high volume of feeder cows and paddock or feeder conditioned calves. The market held up well over all categories with the exception of bulls suited for live export gaining 45/50c/kg.

Local weaner steers sold from 374c to 466c while weaner heifers were making 224c to 422c/kg. Local yearling steers were selling from 360c to 450c while yearling heifers ranged 270c to 426c/kg. Pastoral steer calves started from 290c up to 424c and pastoral heifers from 50c up to 302c/kg.

Grown steers ranged from 268c to 380c while grown heifers returned 250c to 372c/kg. Light plain pastoral store cows ranged from 50c to 180c while bigger framed feeder cows made from 200c to 304c/kg. Medium weight cows returned 280c to 342c and heavy cows sold to a top of 354c/kg.

Plain bulls back to paddocks sold from 100c to 250c while light bull calves weighing 155kg sold to 500c/kg. shipping bulls gained 45/50c making 230c to 430c and heavy bulls were firm ranging from 260c to 328c/kg.
