

Muchea Sheep Report 07/10/2025

Yarding 12,918/ sheep 7,272 / lambs 5,646

Numbers increased today by around 2500 head. There was a big influx of New season lambs presented as old season lambs numbers drop away. With nearly 4000 new season lambs, quality improved from last week with many at trade and heavy weights The buying gallery was very crowded with most regulars operating along with a lot of onlookers. Trade and heavy lambs were firm on value however lighter weights lifted \$5/6/head. Same with the mutton market as boning grades recorded gains of \$8/10 while heavier ewes remained equal.

New season store lambs gained \$5/6 ranging from \$92 to \$188 while light lambs sold from \$160 to \$214/head. New season trade weights were selling from \$194 to \$231 and heavy lambs returned \$220 to \$274/head.

Old season store lambs ranged from \$99 to \$176 while light lambs were selling from \$158 to \$181/head. Trade lambs returned \$180 to \$231 while heavy lambs sold from \$200 to \$253/head.

Store Merino wether hoggets made \$126 to \$180 and heavy weights with a skin sold to a top of \$240/head. Merino ewe hoggets ranged from \$90 to \$200 while Crossbred hoggets were selling from \$146 to \$220 and younger rams sold to a top of \$200/head.

Boner mutton gained \$8/10 making \$90 to \$185 while medium ewes returned \$170 to \$205 and heavy ewes sold to a top of \$237/head. Heavy wethers were firm selling from \$162 to \$230 while mature rams sold from \$80 to \$180/head.
