

Muchea Sheep Report 14/10/2025

Yarding 17,295/ sheep 8,798 / lambs 8,497

There was a large jump in supply today with a big flush of new season lambs as well as large lines of ewes on offer. The regulars in the buying field were all operating as well as several seasonal restockers and this week, fewer spectators. Store lambs eased \$8/10 and heavier lambs were cheaper by \$15/20 while boning grade mutton were slightly cheaper by \$4/5 and heavier mutton were firm.

New season store lambs ranged from \$60 to \$170 while airfreight weights sold from \$154 to \$201/head. Trade weight lambs were selling from \$183 to \$222 and heavy lambs returned \$210 to \$262/head.

Old season store lambs ranged from \$90 to \$140 while light lambs were selling from \$120 to \$160 and heavier lambs returned \$161 to \$212/head.

Light weight Merino wether hoggets sold from \$93 to \$148 while heavier wether hoggets made \$150 to \$196 and Merino ewe hoggets made \$109 to \$179/head. Crossbred hoggets returned \$80 to \$180 and younger rams sold to a top of \$240/head.

Boner mutton were making \$100 to \$181 while medium ewes returned \$150 to \$220 and heavy ewes sold to a top of \$246/head. Heavy wethers were selling from \$150 to \$240 while mature rams sold from \$50 to \$176/head.
