

Muchea Cattle Report 20/10/2025

Yarding 1406

There were slightly fewer cattle yarded this week at Muchea with 1406 head. Again, it was a mixed sale with quality filled runs of heavy steers, heifers and cows, big lines of local well-bred yearlings and large drafts of light weight pastoral calves. Feedlot buyers, restockers and live exporters were all strongly chasing stock lifting the market across most categories.

Local weaner steers were up 10c selling from 324c to 472c while weaner heifers were firm making 238c to 376c with one exceptional calf making 450c/kg. Local yearling steers in all weight categories gained 10c selling from 350c to 470c while yearling heifers remained equal making 270c to 418c/kg. Pastoral steer calves started from 174c up to 376c with more frame and weight while pastoral heifers ranged from 120c up to 320c for the better calves.

Local grown steers returned 368c to 402c while pastoral grown steers made 288c to 360c/kg. Local grown heifers sold from 338c to 388c and pastoral grown heifers from 244c to 300c/kg.

The cow market was mostly up 20/30c and in some places 40c with Light framed pastoral store cows selling from 106c to 260c while bigger framed store cows made 250c to 326c/kg. Medium to heavy cows returned 290c to 350c/kg.

Bulls were in demand with most selling to exporters or processors with shipping bulls making 234c to 354c gaining 25/30c and heavy bulls sold from 240c to 312c, lifting 10c/kg.
