

Muchea Cattle Report 27/10/2025

Yarding 1632

Numbers were virtually the same as the last sale with 29 less. There were some very good runs of trade weights and fat cows along with good lines of local yearlings and weaners. Pastoral cattle ranged from very well presented and finished bodies as well as big lines of plain calves under 300kgs both in the trade sale and the calf sale.

Local weaner steers lacking cover started from 250c to 350c and with more fat cover sold up to 460c while lighter weaner heifers ranged from 198c to 278c and better presented heifers reached a top of 404c/kg. Local yearling steers under 330kg sold from 350c to 430c and heavier weights from 360c to 440c/kg. Yearling heifers under 330kg were selling from 208c to 302c and with more weight and frame sold from 250c to 408c/kg. Plain pastoral steer calves started from 180c to 280c and with more frame and cover sold up to 432c/kg. The same story for pastoral heifers starting from 164c to 230c and better presented heifers with good fat cover and glossy skins ranged from 275c to 390c/kg.

Local grown steers returned from 344c to 434c while pastoral grown steers made 246c to 374c and Grown heifers collectively sold from 320c to 408c/kg.

The cow market eased 10/15c with store cows selling from 160c to 290c while medium weight cows made 218c to 312c and heavy cows sold to a top of 316c/kg.

Plain bulls back to paddocks sold from 150c to 310c while bulls suited for shipping sold from 210c to 372c and heavy bulls gained 10/15c selling from 208c to 312c/kg.
