



Muceha Sheep Report 11/11/2025

Yarding 12,553/ sheep 8,273/ lambs 4,280

It was a similar sale to last week with around the same volume of both lambs and sheep. Quality was also similar as well with limited heavy lambs on offer and mutton was penned in large lines. All the regular faces were in the buying group and all were bidding with feedlotter and live export both active on the midrange lambs keeping values firm to recent pricing and the remainder of the sale as a whole was firm.

New season store lambs ranged from \$82 to \$175 while airfreight weights returned \$168 to \$198/head. Trade weight lambs were selling from \$184 to \$230 and most heavy lambs sold from \$223 to \$242 with one exceptional pen reaching \$260/head.

Old season lambs were too few to quote however light framed Merino wether hoggets made \$50 to \$150 and with heavier frames sold to a top of \$249/head. Merino ewe hoggets were making \$110 to \$178 while Crossbred hoggets returned \$110 to \$200 and younger rams sold to a top of \$240/head.

Demand for boning mutton was strong with small framed light ewes selling from \$50 to \$144 while bigger framed boners sold from \$100 to \$176/head. Medium weight ewes returned \$172 to \$221 and heavy ewes from \$190 to \$236/head. Heavy wethers were making \$180 to \$240 with a skin while mature rams ranged from \$50 to \$180 depending on age and quality
