

Muchea Sheep Report 18/11/2025

Yarding 6,702/ sheep 3,869 / lambs 2,833

Numbers halved from the previous sale and again lambs with weight were limited in supply. While store lambs remained equal the light volume of heavier grades helped lift their values by \$15/20/head. Mutton was also in demand and received improved rates regardless of weight with boning grades gaining the most. Wethers were also keenly sought after in any frame size and fat score lifting \$25-30/head.

New season store lambs ranged from \$66 to \$170 while airfreight weights sold from \$166 to \$194/head. Heavier lambs gained \$15-20 with trade weights selling from \$196 to \$248 and heavy lambs returned \$238 to \$281/head.

Lighter framed Merino wether hoggets sold from \$130 to \$158 and with more weight and wool sold to a top of \$237/head. Only light merino ewe hoggets were yarded and ranged from \$146 to \$160 while Crossbred hoggets started from \$120 and topped at \$255/head.

Boner mutton gained \$10-15 making \$120 to \$188 while heavier ewes were dearer by \$5-7 and returned \$175 to \$240/head. Wethers lifted with light frames selling from \$152 to \$208 and heavy wethers from \$211 to \$253 while mature rams sold from \$80 to \$180/head.
