

Muchea Sheep Report 02/12/2025

Yarding 15,336 / sheep 10,596 / lambs 4,740

Numbers lifted today with large drafts of heavy ewes and several lines of very well presented heavy lambs that reached a top of \$320 while most lambs were in store and feeder condition. With a full buying field the lamb market was able to record similar values to last week's gains with Quality reflecting the price on the heavy lambs while the mutton market eased \$5/10/head.

Store lambs ranged from \$50 to \$179 while airfreight weights sold from \$150 to \$200/head. Trade weight lambs were selling from \$184 to \$232 and heavy lambs returned \$240 to \$320/head.

Light Merino wether hoggets sold from \$140 to \$170 while heavy weights sold to a top of \$256/head. Plain Merino ewe hoggets were making \$120 to \$177 and heavy weights sold to a top of \$263/head with a skin. The best of the Crossbred hoggets returned \$179 to \$245 and younger rams sold to a top of \$267/head.

Boner mutton sold from \$95 to \$183 while medium ewes returned \$168 to \$233 and heavy ewes were sold to a top of \$240/head. Heavy wethers lifted \$10 selling from \$200 to \$280 while mature rams sold from \$80 to \$200/head.
