

Muchea Cattle Report 15/12/2025

1476 liveweight and 36 veal / total 1512

Pastoral cattle were still prominent making up around 50% of the yarding alongside well presented local lines of weaners for the last sale of the year. With a full buying gallery the market held up well with the exception of Heavy bulls easing 15/20c and demand for shipping bulls was not as strong as previous weeks

Local weaner steers were selling from 316c to 460c while weaner heifers were making 236c to 446c/kg. Local yearling steers under 330kg sold from 270c to 424c and heavier weights from 308c to 442c/kg. Yearling heifers under 330kg were selling from 266c to 336c and with more weight and frame sold up to 394c/kg. Pastoral steer calves sold to a top of 420c while the best pastoral heifers made 350c/kg.

Grown steers ranged from 280c to 354c while grown heifers returned 288c to 320c/kg. Store cows sold from 100c to 254c while medium weights returned 270c to 316c and heavy cows sold to a top of 340c/kg.

Plain bulls back to paddocks ranged from 200c to 274c while bulls suited for shipping were making 240c to 376c and heavy bulls eased 20c to return 230c to 310c/kg. And a reminder that the next trade sale for cattle at Muchea will be on Monday the 5th of January
