

Muchea Cattle Report 01/12/2025

2775 liveweight and 152 veal / total 2927

It was the biggest sale since the covid restrictions with just short of 3000 head and was another mixed sale with good supplies of local weaners and yearlings as well as heavy trade weights and cows while pastoral cattle of all categories were presented in large drafts. The buying gallery had all the regulars present as well as restockers and feedlot buyers from various areas around the state lifting prices of both local and pastoral calves.

The top local weaner steers realized 524c while local weaner heifers sold to 420c/kg. Local yearling steers reached 502c while local yearling heifers topped at 402c/kg. Pastoral steer calves ranged from 290c to 410c and pastoral heifers from 148c to 378c depending on condition.

Grown steers returned 300c to 400c while grown heifers made 260c to 378c/kg. Store cows sold from 156c to 230c while medium weight cows returned 250c to 338c and heavy cows sold to a top of 354c/kg.

Bulls suited for shipping sold from 300c to 398c and heavy bulls c ranged from 306c to 332c/kg.
