



Muchea Cattle Report 12/01/2026

1194 liveweight and 40 veal / total 1234

Numbers lifted by nearly 300 today at Muchea with just over 1200 head.

The sale had something for everyone with good runs of yearlings and excellent runs of both weaner steer and heifer. Fat cows were also presented along with large volumes of store cows while bull supplies were conservative. Yearling steer prices remained firm to slightly dearer while yearling heifers as well as weaner steers and heifers recorded gains and with an extra store cow buyer from the south adding competition, store cows lifted 40/50c/kg.

Local weaner steers started from 286c with most lines gaining 20/25c selling from 420c to 494c/kg. Weaner heifers also gained 25/30c and sold from 300c to 416c/kg. Yearling steers under 400kg sold from 350c to 440c and heavier weights from 362c to 416c to remain equal. Yearling heifers gained 20/25c with heifers under 400kg selling from 295c to 410c and with more weight sold from 306c to 412c/kg. Pastoral steer calves ranged from 220c to 388c while pastoral heifers were making 200c to 374c/kg.

Grown steers returned 324c to 392c while grown heifers returned 254c to 380c/kg. Store cows sold very well gaining up to 50c selling from 200c to 338c while medium to heavy weight cows started from 280c with most sales from 310c to 350c/kg.

Shipping bulls were selling from 220c to 342c and heavy bulls sold from 250c to 334c/kg.
