



Muchea Cattle Report 02/02/2026

1839 liveweight and 26 veal / total 1865

There was a significant jump in supply today with cows being the dominant factor in the yarding, particularly store cows drafted in large lines with many lines over several pens each. Mature bulls were prominent and the remaining categories were all well represented in volume. With a full contingency of regular buyers and store buyers from northern and southern areas prices held up well with recent gains on cows while weaner steers and heifers lifted 10/12c and slaughter bulls gained 30c/kg.

Local weaner steers were selling from 320c to 446c while weaner heifers were making 250c to 396c/kg. Local yearling steers under 330kg sold from 322c to 450c and heavier weights from 304c to 440c/kg. Yearling heifers under 330kg were selling from 280c to 370c and with more weight and frame sold up to 402c/kg. Pastoral steer calves ranged from 170c up to 394c quality dependent and pastoral heifers from 140c to 378c, again on quality.

Grown steers ranged from 272c to 384c while grown heifers returned 330c to 380c/kg. pastoral and local store cows sold from 160c to 316c while medium weights returned 220c to 334c and heavy cows sold to 350c/kg.

Plain bulls back to paddocks sold from 200c to 310c while bulls suited for shipping were making 216c to 368c and heavy bulls lifted 30c ranging from 250c to 328c/kg.
