



Muceha Sheep Report 10/02/2026

Yarding 8,325/ sheep 2,685 / lambs 5,640

Today's sale total was only 245 down from last week however the lamb volume was up by around 1200 for a total of 5640 while older sheep supplies were down roughly 1600 for a total of only 2685. With several feedlot buyers and an eastern states buyer bidding against the regular gallery, competition was very strong on store and feeder type lambs, particularly larger drafts of Merino store lambs which sold exceptionally well gaining \$5/7/head. Heavier lambs were firm to slightly dearer with 2 pens of extra heavy lambs selling for \$300 and \$310 respectively. Mutton was generally equal with one pen of exceptional heavy ewes making \$280 while wethers also reached \$270/head.

Store lambs started from \$80 up to \$202 while light lambs made \$160 to \$222/head. Trade weights returned \$205 to \$265 and heavy lambs sold from \$251 to \$310/head.

Merino wether hoggets were few and sold from \$180 to \$230 and the same for the limited pens of Merino ewe hoggets also making \$180 to \$230/head. Crossbred hoggets on the heavier side returned \$160 to \$290 and younger rams sold to a top of \$264/head.

Boning ewes ranged \$100 to \$164 while medium weights returned \$170 to \$227 and heavy ewes sold to a top of \$280/head. Heavy wethers ranged from \$182 to \$270 while mature rams sold from \$80 to \$205/head.
