



## Muceha Cattle Report 16/03/2026

*893 liveweight and 25 veal / total 918*

It was a similar size yarding to last week's market and while the cow yarding doubled this week the sale was predominantly made up of yearlings and weaners. Several faces were absent from the buying field however this did not retract from increases in values in most categories, particularly heifers

Local weaner steers gained 10c and sold from 324c to 492c while weaner heifers lifted 15/20c, starting from 306c selling up to 434c/kg. Local yearling steers under 400kg remained equal returning 350c to 440c, while heavier weights were dearer by 10/15c selling from 360c to 472c/kg. Yearling heifers gained 30c with weights under 400kg making 348c to 440c and with more weight and frame sold from 360c to 430c/kg. Pastoral steer calves were mostly in either good condition or locally fed and sold from 268c to 380c to remain firm while pastoral heifers lifted 20/25c ranging from 218c to 382c/kg.

Grown steers were in short supply and remained equal selling from 310c to 378c while grown heifers, also limited in number, lifted 10c to return 340c to 392c/kg. Store cows gained 10c and ranged from 150c to 298c depending on frame size while medium weights returned 280c to 328c and heavy cows sold to a top of 354c also gaining 10c/kg.

Shipping bulls sold from 230c to 360c while the few heavy bulls yarded sold from 250c to 322c regaining last week's dip in value.
