



Muchea Cattle Report 23/03/2026

1406 liveweight and 14 veal / total 1420

Today Muchea had a large yarding of mostly yearlings and weaners and lighter numbers of cows and bulls. The buyer gallery was attended by most of the regulars as well as buyers from southern districts and interest from eastern states bidding on the lighter calves. Weaners in particular were presented nicely in large lines with quality well-bred driven gains of 25/30c for steers reaching 522c and heifers lifting 45/50c to reach 498c/kg. Heavy cows also gained 10c as did slaughter bulls lifting 25/30c/kg.

Local weaner steers were selling from 400c to 522c while weaner heifers sold over a wider price range from 274c to 498c/kg. Local yearling steers weighing under 400kg returned 350c to 424c and heavier weights from 388c to 466c/kg. Yearling heifers under 400kg were selling from 288c to 436c and heavier heifers from 300c to 448c/kg. Pastoral steer calves with good fat cover sold from 334c to 442c while pastoral heifers showing condition ranged from 224c to 420c/kg.

Grown steers returned from 356c to 380c while grown heifers returned 300c to 382c/kg. Light framed pastoral store cows sold from 94c to 194c while bigger framed store cows made 208c to 300c/kg. Medium weight cows returned 290c to 344c and most heavy cows ranged from 330c to 358c with 2 very well bred cows reaching a top of 390c/kg.

Shipping bulls were making 270c to 382c while heavy bulls gained 25/30c selling from 272c to 368c/kg.
