



Muceha Sheep Report 24/03/2026

Yarding 9,477/ sheep 3,523 / lambs 5,954

Lamb supply was down by approximately 1000 head from last week while sheep numbers were around the same volume. The buying field was crowded with all processors operating along with several seasonal restockers, feedlot buyers and continued interest from eastern states lifting values on store lambs and heavy mutton. Store lambs gained \$8/10 in places while heavier lambs were firm to slightly dearer. Boning grade mutton remained firm while heavier ewes also lifted \$4/\$6/head.

Store lambs started from \$44 up to \$209 while light lambs made \$164 to \$227/head. Trade weights returned \$220 to \$245 while heavy lambs sold from \$230 to \$298/head.

Merino wether hoggets sold from \$154 to \$214 while Merino ewe hoggets were making \$90 to \$220/head. Crossbred hoggets over 22kg cwt returned \$160 to \$256 and younger rams sold to a top of \$251/head.

Boning ewes were making \$80 to \$150 while medium weights returned \$160 to \$230 and heavy ewes from \$232 to \$259/head. Heavy wethers ranged from \$170 to \$236 while mature rams sold from \$80 to \$254 with selected pens gaining \$20/25/head.
