



Muchea Cattle Report 13/04/2026

855 liveweight and 0 veal / total 855

It was a light yarding following the Easter break with weaners making up a large percentage of the sale as more and more light weight calves well under 200kg's are being sold in the trade sale instead of a separate calf sale. Trade weight steers and heifers, as well as cow and bull supplies were more conservative. With a full buyers gallery operating the cow market gained 10c as did heavy bulls while lighter weight bulls remained equal. Trade steers and heifers also lifted 10c while yearlings and weaners remained firm with the exception of weaner heifers gaining 8/10c/kg.

Local weaner steers were selling from 340c to 552c while weaner heifers returned 284c to 472c/kg. Yearling steers were scarce and sold from 384c to 444c while yearling heifers were also few in supply and were making 328c to 428c/kg. There were very few pastoral steer calves yarded and sold to a top of 320c while pastoral heifers ranged from 280c up to 340c/kg.

Grown steers returned from 340c to 396c while grown heifers ranged from 294c to 420c/kg.

Store cows sold from 224c to 308c, Medium weight cows returned 310c to 350c and heavy cows sold to a top of 366c/kg.

Young bulls sold from 290c to 348c as live exporters were only bidding on light weights while heavy bulls ranged from 268c to 352c/kg.
