



Muceha Sheep Report 14/04/2026

Yarding 14,956 / sheep 3,606 / lambs 11,350

Numbers jumped substantially by 11000 head at Muceha today from the last trade sale before the Easter break. This was due to an influx of trade and heavy lamb supplies while older sheep numbers remained at a similar throughput. The buying gallery was filled with most local regulars while the fuel prices of late haven't deterred interest from eastern states buyers. Store lambs lifted \$10/12 while light and trade lambs recorded equal values and heavy lambs also gained \$12 with well presented lots on offer. Boning grade mutton eased \$8/10 while heavier ewes recorded equal values.

Rough skinned store lambs started from \$50 up to \$209 for better types while light lambs were making \$170 to \$228/head. Trade lambs returned \$210 to \$242 while heavy lambs made \$240 to \$275 and extra heavy lambs with a cwt more than 26kg sold from \$280 to \$340/head.

Merino wether hoggets sold from \$120 to \$220 depending on condition while Merino ewe hoggets were making \$130 to \$240 with a skin. Crossbred hoggets returned \$209 to \$240 and younger rams sold to a top of \$270/head.

Boning ewes were making \$127 to \$171 while medium weights returned \$170 to \$230 and heavy ewes sold from \$220 to \$280/head. Heavy wethers ranged from \$181 to \$279 while mature rams sold from \$80 to \$257/head.
