



Muchea Cattle Report 28/04/2026

365 liveweight and 0 veal / total 365

The Anzac long weekend saw numbers reduced to just 365 head for Muchea's cattle sale today. There were several lines of good quality trade steers and heifers and the odd pen of fat cows, as well as a good run of Charolais bulls while the larger percentage of the sale was in plain store condition. This was reflected in younger cattle selling at quality driven reduced rates while cows gained 5/10c on lighter lines.

Local weaner steers were selling from 220c to 484c while weaner heifers sold from 250c to 430c/kg. Local yearling steers were mostly in store condition selling from 344c to 484c while yearling heifers returned 290c to 410c/kg. Pastoral steer calves, depending on fat cover ranged from 190c to 358c while pastoral heifers made 150c to 300c/kg.

Grown steers eased 15/20c selling from 322c to 350c while grown heifers returned 346c to 386c/kg. Store cows lifted selling from 184c to 310c while medium to heavy cows returned 302c to 358c/kg.

Young bulls ranged from 220c to 378c while heavy bulls sold from 240c to 354c/kg.
