



## Muceha Sheep Report 28/04/2026

*Yarding 7,681/ sheep 3,319 / lambs 4,362*

Sheep numbers were down marginally while lamb supplies were reduced by around 4500. Heavy lambs were short in number, while trade lambs were more prominent and while most store lambs were good quality there were runs of light plain tail end lines. Most of the regular buyers were operating with most categories of sheep and lambs holding values with the plainer lines selling at reduced rates.

Store lambs started from \$40 up to \$207, while light lambs made \$170 to \$230/head. Trade weights returned \$216 to \$248 while heavy lambs sold from \$239 to \$278/head.

Merino wether hoggets sold from \$155 to \$220, while Merino ewe hoggets were making \$120 to \$230 quality dependent. Crossbred hoggets ranged from \$120 to \$240 and younger rams sold to a top of \$254/head.

Light plain ewes sold from \$74 to \$110 while better boning grades returned \$120 to \$180/head. Medium weight ewes made \$170 to \$230 and heavy ewes sold to a top of \$240/head. Heavy wethers ranged from \$177 to \$230 while mature rams sold from \$40 to \$198/head.
