



Muceha Sheep Report 05/05/2026

Yarding 10,905/ sheep 3,876 / lambs 7,029

Quality ewes and lambs were presented across all agents today recording a very strong sale. With feedlot and eastern states buyers competing on the better end of store lambs and airfreight weights, values lifted \$10/12/head. Trade weight lambs realised marginal gains while heavy lambs enjoyed quality driven gains of \$12/15 reaching \$296/head with one very heavy lamb weighing around 80kgs lwt selling for \$350 as a one-off sale and an exception to the rule. The mutton was also stronger, recording gains off \$4/5/head.

Small, plain store lambs started from \$70 up to \$214 with bigger frames while light lambs gained \$10/15 making \$180 to \$236/head. Trade weights lifted marginally returning \$210 to \$248 while heavy lambs sold from \$240 to \$296/head.

Store Merino wether hoggets sold from \$150 to \$186 and heavy weights with a skin sold to a top of \$251/head. Light Merino ewe hoggets were making \$100 to \$176 and heavier ewes sold to a top of \$240/head. Crossbred hoggets showing finish returned \$190 to \$247 and younger rams sold to a top of \$270/head.

Mutton was dearer by \$4/5 with boning grades selling from \$100 to \$180, medium weights from \$176 to \$240 and heavy ewes sold to a top of \$245/head. Heavy wethers ranged from \$180 to \$240 while mature rams ranged from \$80 to \$260/head.
