



Muchea Sheep Report 26/05/2026

Yarding 11,335/ sheep 2,686 / lambs 8,649

The sale total today was similar to last week with 11335 however lamb numbers were well supplied with just over 8500/head with fair representation across all categories. The buying group had the usual processors operating with several extra feedlot and restockers adding competition to the sale which started off very strong and lost a little traction as the sale progressed. Lambs across the board lifted in value today with store lambs recovering last week's cheaper trends and heavier lambs sold to a strong demand gaining \$10/15/head.

Store lambs started from \$75 up to \$218 with bigger frames while light lambs made \$160 to \$234/head. Trade weights up to 22kg cwt returned \$200 to \$259 while heavy lambs sold from \$245 to \$280 and cwt's over 26kg realized \$329/head. Ram lambs ranged from \$120 to \$208 for light weights and topped out at \$308/head for the heavy weights

Merino wether hoggets ranged from \$120 to \$230 with a skin while light Merino ewe hoggets were making \$110 to \$160 and heavy weights sold to a top of \$239/head. The limited Crossbred and Dorper hoggets on offer returned \$108 to \$250 depending on weight and younger rams sold to a top of \$204/head.

Boning ewes were making \$90 to \$180 while medium weights returned \$170 to \$221 and heavy ewes gained \$10 selling to a top of \$286/head. Heavy wethers ranged from \$200 to \$231 while mature rams sold from \$120 to \$180/head.
