



Muceha Sheep Report 23/06/2026

Yarding 5,018/ sheep 765 / lambs 4,253

Although the sale throughput was still conservative, lamb supplies increased by approximately 1000 head, yarding just over 4000 while sheep supplies remained tight with only 765 penned. Bigger framed store lambs and airfreight weights were again keenly sought while trade lambs lifted \$5/7/head. With a major processor absent, Mutton and mature ram values held firm on recent gains.

Small framed store lambs were slightly cheaper today while better framed stores and feeder weights held firm to slightly dearer starting from \$50 up to \$188 for stores and \$160 to \$232 for light lambs. Trade weights gained \$5/7 to return \$220 to \$256 while heavy lambs sold from \$240 to \$310/head. One pen of mid weight new season lambs made \$208 and ram lambs were selling well with a pen of heavy Merino's reaching \$340/head.

Store Merino wether hoggets sold from \$145 to \$207 while heavy weights realised \$255/head. Store Merino ewe hoggets were making \$166 to \$195 and heavy weights sold to a top of \$238/head. Heavy Crossbred hoggets returned \$220 to \$252 and younger rams sold to a top of \$288/head.

There were only the odd pen of boning ewes selling from \$170 to \$180 while medium and heavy weights returned \$180 to \$250/head. Heavy wethers sold from \$200 to \$270 while mature rams ranged from \$114 to \$278/head.
