



Muchea Cattle Report 29/06/2026

1541 liveweight and 1 veal / total 1542

Numbers were up for a total yarding of 1542 head. Prices generally trended up with quality being the variant. Quality Angus weaner steer calves sold to 658c while the heifers sold to 560c/kg. Heavy cows eased on last week's spike as did the heavy bulls. Pastoral cattle were in good numbers with varied quality.

Local weaner steers gained 60c selling from 400c to 658c while weaner heifers followed suit selling to 560c/kg. Local yearling steers returned 370c to 578 for the best while yearling heifers were selling from 420c to 496c/kg. Pastoral steer calves sold from 310c to 448c/kg. Pastoral heifers made from 280c to 470c/kg.

Grown steers weighing over 600kg sold from 430c to 460c while lighter weights returned 380c to 490c/kg. Grown heifers weighing under 540kg sold from 300c to 432c and heavier weights made 388c to 396c/kg. Store cows made 130c to 328c, medium weights gained returned 306c to 395c for young ages while heavy cows eased selling to a top of 368c/kg.

Restockers and exporters paid 220c to 470c for young bulls while heavy bulls returned 282c to 350c/kg.
