

Muchea Cattle Report 27.07.2026

1486 liveweight and 7 veal / total 1493

Today's sale total fell away from last week's combined trade and store sale down to 722 with pricing decreasing only marginally with less targeted buyers at hand.

The sale consisted of a reasonably even percentage of local and pastoral lines with large drafts of Angus heifers as well as big lines of pastoral steers and heifers on offer. Pastoral cattle were also presented over a large variation of quality which was reflected in a wide pricing margin.

Local weaner steers were selling from 415c to 570c while weaner heifers depending on quality started from 250c and sold up to 538c/kg. Local yearling steers weighing under 400kg returned 326c to 524c while heavier weights sold from 352c to 480c/kg. Yearling heifers were consistent and sold from 400c to 486c across the board. Pastoral steer calves sold from 440c to 488c while yearling steers made 300c to 450c/kg. Pastoral heifer calves sold over a wide range from 180c to 396c and yearling heifers from 220c to 436c/kg.

Grown steers ranged from 302c to 480c while grown heifers returned 370c to 430c/kg. Light framed pastoral store cows sold from 120c to 250c while larger framed stores made 252c to 300c/kg. Medium weight cows returned 290c to 338c and heavy cows sold to a top of 360c/kg.

Young bulls heading back to paddocks sold from 202c to 374c while shipping bulls were making 280c to 418c/kg. Heavy pastoral bulls sold from 280c to 336c while local bulls sold to a top of 350c/kg.
